

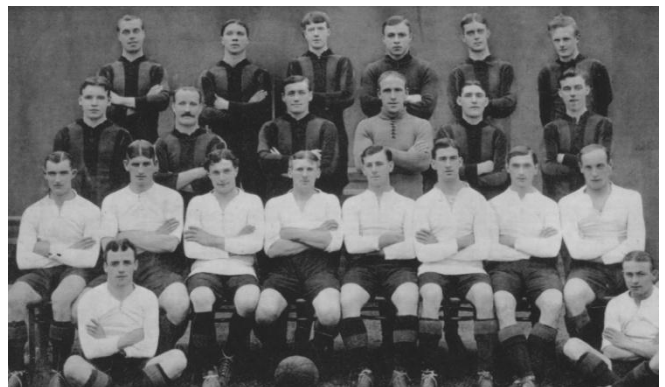
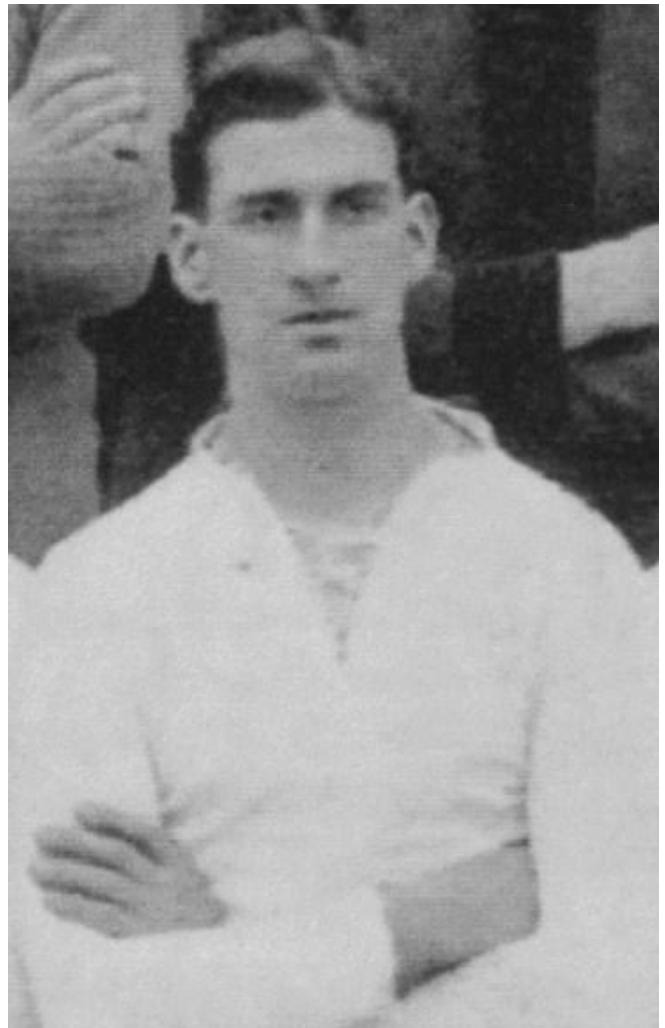
## No.24 Herbert Lloyd

Herbert was equally at home operating either as a wing-half or inside forward. Like many a young man of his time, he broke into League Football just before the First World War, losing his better years to that conflict.

Born in Cannock, 13 March 1888, Herbert had already appeared for Cannock, Walsall, Rotherham County and Crystal Palace, all outside the Football League, before joining Wolves in 1913 to play eight matches during that season and score one goal in their Second Division side.

Former Hednesford goalkeeper, Walter Hayes, and future Hednesford players, keeper Teddy Peers and fullbacks Ted Collins and George Garratley, were members of the same Wolves team.

A year later, he was at Hednesford Town, moving back to Rotherham County, by now a Second Division club, when League Football kicked-off again in 1919. Herbert appeared in 18 League and FA Cup games for Rotherham, in his one season with them, before dropping into non-league football with Scunthorpe & Lindsey United in 1920. Herbert died in 1960.
